Where sex education is given, pupils must:

- be encouraged to have “due regard to moral considerations and the value of family life”
- “learn the nature of marriage and its importance for family life and the bringing up of children”

and

- be “protected from teaching and materials which are inappropriate having regard to the age and the religious and cultural background of the pupils concerned.”

If a parent is not satisfied with the school’s approach, they can withdraw their child from teaching, except for that which is part of the Science curriculum.

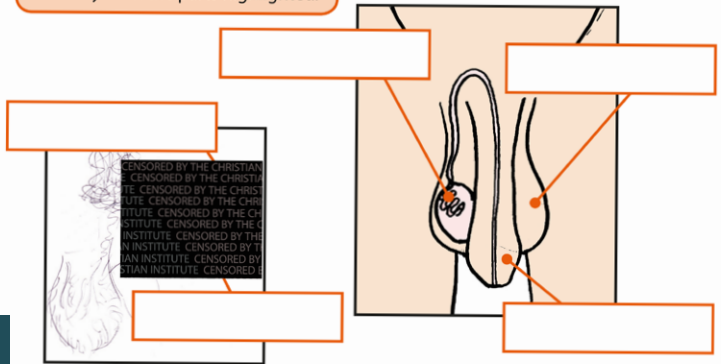

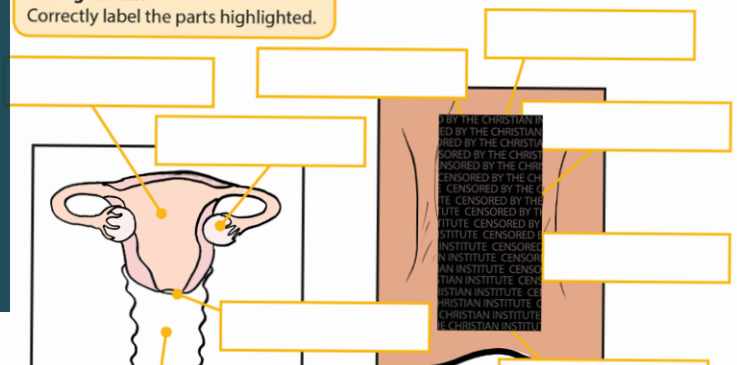
Boy's genitals:

This is a term usually found only on pornography and adult sex sites. 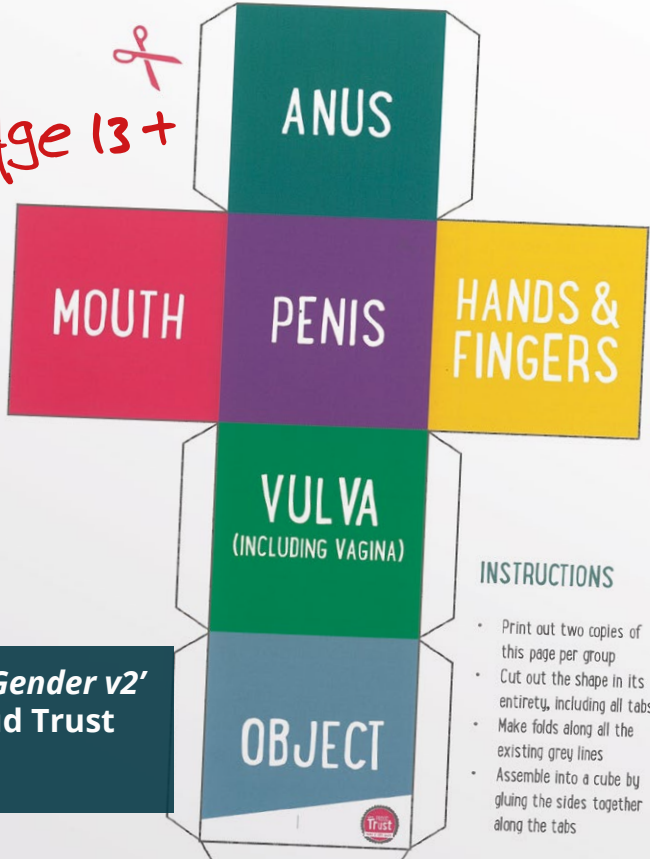
Recommended for young people aged 13 years and upwards

Time	Activity	Method
40 min	The Dice Game	<p>Ask for two volunteers to blow up the inflatable dice, one each. When inflated, explain to the group that this activity is an exploration of the pleasure and risk factors associated with various sexual activities, as the dice determine.</p> <p>The game: Ask group members, in turn, to roll both dice. Dice rollers should then say, out loud, the word on the upward facing face of the dice they have rolled (e.g. vulva and mouth).</p> <p>Questions to ask the group after each roll:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What are the possible things that can be done when these two meet? (e.g. oral sex).

Schools should not promote harmful gender stereotypes

On 1 December 2020, the High Court ruled that puberty blockers and cross-sex hormones are experimental treatments, and giving them to children will generally be illegal. But some teaching resources continue to promote the harmful narrative that children who don't conform to gender stereotypes may in fact be the opposite sex.

All of the books below are recommended by organisations that work with schools on RSE

George by Alex Gino

George feels like he's a girl 'on the inside'. He reads girls' magazines and imagines himself wearing make-up. He is also shown to be very emotional, in stark contrast to his 'masculine' teenage brother.

Gracefully Grayson by Ami Polonsky

Grayson likes to draw princesses with glitter pens and longs to wear feminine clothes. These stereotypes are used to say that he is really a girl.

Jamie by Olly Pike

Jamie is "very handy" and "great at fixing things". She even builds her own car. Instead of encouraging girls to be engineers and mechanics, the book says Jamie discovers she is actually a boy.

10,000 dresses by Marcus Ewert

Bailey is a boy who dreams of fantastical dresses to wear. He befriends an older girl who makes dresses and helps her come up with inventive designs. This allows him to express his 'true female self'.

I am Jazz by Jessica Herthel and Jazz Jennings

Based on a real life story. A series of gender stereotypes are used to reveal that Jazz is really a girl, not a boy. Jazz recalls: "I hardly ever played with trucks or tools or superheroes. Only princesses and mermaid costumes."

I am Fred by Nick Rolfe

Felicity is called 'Fred', a "boy trapped inside a girl's body". Fred never liked pink, always wanted "cars and army things" instead of dolls, wants short hair and won't wear dresses. These preferences are used to say that Fred has a "boy's heart and a boy's mind".
